



99th Signal Battalion (USAR)

Constituted 3 November 1941 in the Regular Army as the 99th Signal Battalion

Activated 10 March 1942 at Fort Ord, California

Inactivated 31 January 1946 in Japan

Allotted 19 January 1954 to the Army Reserve

Activated 1 March 1954 with Headquarters at Plattsburg, New York (Company B concurrently activated.)

(Company A activated 15 February 1955 at Plattsburg, New York; Company B concurrently inactivated.)

Location of Headquarters changed 1 February 1956 to New York, New York

Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 99th Signal Battalion, inactivated 15 August 1959 at New York, New York

Redesignated 15 September 1959 as Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, 99th Signal Battalion

Ordered into active military service 15 October 1961 at New York, New York

Released from active military service 8 August 1962 and reverted to reserve status

Location of Headquarters changed 31 January 1966 to Fort Tilden, New York; on 1 October 1977 to Brooklyn, New York (Organic elements activated 31 January 1968)

Ordered into active military service (less Company A) 24 March 1970 at Fort Hamilton, New York; released from active military service 26 March 1970 and reverted to reserve status

Inactivated 15 September 1996 at Brooklyn, New York
