

A Message From The President **MG Joseph P. O'Leary (Ret)**

His appreciation was intended for every soldier and airman in our force - All 460,000 of us. He made it clear from the start that he wanted to hear our concerns. The meeting lasted about an hour and a number of issues were discussed. Equipment shortages at home dominated the conversation. The Army has programmed 36 Billion for army guard equipment over the next 5 years and Defense Secretary Gates and Army Secretary Geran assured the President and NGAUS leadership that the money would be "Fenced" to make sure it won't be Re-allocated for other uses.

When the President of the U.S. wanted to thank the Guard who did he call?... NGAUS, the organization that represents us at the national level just as the military association of New York (MANY) represents us to our state leadership. The strength of both these organizations is in numbers --us. Membership is voluntary. Professional people belong to professional organizations.

Every now and then he has a little difficulty speaking and when he gets tired he gets a little confused, but for the most part you'd never know anything was wrong.

Although he can now move both legs he does not have the strength to walk so he went back to the nursing home for some rehab. His spirits are good and we think he'll be going back home in a few weeks. We all wish you get well soon Bob.

All is well, making progress with Ministerial (Ministry of Interior) capacity building. Working closely with my Iraqi counterpart, Director of Special Communications to IOM C2 and Emergency Comms for Iraq. We use two systems, IC2N, Iraq Cmd & Control Network, a satellite centric system for all Police forces and AFRN, Advanced First Responder Network, a Terrestrial Trunked Radio (TETRA) (formerly known as Trans European Trunked Radio) is a specialist Professional Mobile Radio and two-way transceiver, designed for use by government agencies, and specifically emergency services, the police forces, fire departments, ambulance, RATP, SNCF-Strasburg transport services and the military.
